Peter Wilson AM is Chairman of the Australian Human Resource Institute. He is also Chairman of Yarra Valley Water Limited and Vision Super; and a non-executive Director on the Board of the World Federation of People Management Associations, in Switzerland; Vincent Fairfax Ethics in Leadership Foundation;. He is also a Member of the Advisory Council for the Harvard Business Review, an Adjunct Professor in Management at Monash University, and a member of the Society of Human Resources Management's 100 Global HR Thought Leaders since 2010.
